The role of the university in a changing climate

Public talk by Professor Keri Facer

Keri Facer is Professor of Educational and Social Futures at the University of Bristol, School of Education and Zennström Chair in Climate Change Leadership, University of Uppsala.



Keri Facer is rethinking the relationship between formal educational institutions and wider society and the sorts of knowledge that may be needed to address contemporary environmental, economic, social and technological changes.

Keri will argue that the implications of climate change for universities goes far beyond becoming aware of our climate emissions. Instead, she proposes that the role of the university should be to assist in the civilizational change that will be required to come to terms with living with a lively planet. This has implications for curriculum, for the relationships between universities and their communities, and for the idea of the person at the heart of the educational process.
